2. PURPOSE OF THE COURSE

The purpose of studying the discipline "Tourist Routes of Transcarpathia" is to form special knowledge, skills and abilities of students in the development of new tourist routes, types of tourist routes in the Transcarpathian region, to train highly qualified tourism workers who can provide qualified information during tourist routes, methods of tourist process, development of elements of professional skill of the future expert.

The main tasks of studying the discipline are theoretical and practical training of students on: theory and methods of tourist and excursion business; pedagogical equipment of tourist and excursion work; formation of organizational, communicative and analytical skills; apply in practice the principles and methods of organization and technology of tourist services during the various tourist routes in the Transcarpathian region, identify tourist documentation for the development of tourist routes and other related documents, be able to use it to analyze the needs of a group of tourists and use the necessary forms; independently prepare a tourist route and a set of documents for it; apply the skills of productive communication with consumers of tourist services in the Transcarpathian region, professionally perform tasks in uncertain and extreme situations, especially in extreme routes in the Transcarpathian region.

Subject - methodological principles of tourist route organization, mechanisms of perception of tourist information; ways to attract, concentrate and divert the attention of tourists; logical requirements for the submission of tourist and excursion material.

According to the educational program, the study of this discipline contributes to the formation of higher education in the following competencies:

5. DIAGNOSTICS AND CRITERIA FOR EVALUATION OF LEARNING RESULTS

Assessment tools and methods for demonstrating learning outcomes

Means of assessment and methods of demonstrating learning outcomes in the discipline are:

1) full-time study - current (reports in seminars, development of a tourist route, test tasks on the topic), modular and final semester control in the form of credit; 2) on the correspondence form of training - current control, performance of control work which is the admission to the final semester control in the form of examination. - 1. Oral (the student's answer to a separate question of the topic, a conversation during the consideration of the problem questions, defense of the presentation or project).
 - 2. Written (individual work, current test, modular test).
- 3. Verification of the level of academic achievements of applicants in the discipline is carried out on the basis of the results of modular tests and final control.

Forms (methods) of control and criteria for evaluating learning outcomes

Forms of current control: performance of practical tasks, speeches at seminars, performance of test tasks on the topic.

Form of modular control: modular control work or testing (written).

Form of final semester control: exam.

Criteria for evaluating of modular control work

Current control is carried out during practical classes and aims to verify the assimilation of educational material by students. The form of current control during training is determined by the working curriculum of the discipline. During the evaluation of the mastering of each topic for the current educational activity of the applicant, grades are set taking into account the approved evaluation criteria for the respective discipline.

Modular control is the control of students' knowledge after studying the logically completed part of the discipline curriculum of the content module. The frequency of this type of control is determined by the number of content modules during the semester.

Assessment of academic achievements and practical skills of applicants is carried out on a 100-point system. The total number of points per semester in the discipline consists of the arithmetic mean score for the modules and points for the current control.

In case of receiving a positive final grade for the module, the student has the right to refuse to take the exam. In this case, the general final grade is entered in the test report. Provided that if the student wants to improve the final grade in the discipline, he must pass an exam. The results of the current control are not taken into account.

If the student attended less than 50 percent of classes, then the regularity and activity of his work is estimated at 0 points.

Module assessment. After performing the programme of the content module during the term, determined by the dean's office, the current assessment practice is carried out in the written module form or testing. If for objective reasons the applicant misses the module, within the specified period, he/she has the right, with the permission of the dean, to pass (to retake) it within two weeks after the academic backlog.

If applicant for higher education misses the module test, or his/her module assessment is from 0 to 34 points, it's required to pass the module before the final control within the time, specified by teachers of the discipline and agreed by the dean of the faculty.

In the process of assessing the modular test it takes into account the size and accuracy of the tasks:

- a) the grade "excellent" is given for the correct performance of all tasks;
- b) the grade "good" is given for the performance of 75% of all tasks;
- c) the assessment "satisfactory" is given if more than 50% of the given tasks are performed correctly;
- d) the grade "unsatisfactory" is given if less than 50% of the tasks are completed.

The absence from module control work - 0 points.

These ratings are transformed into rating points as follows:

- "5" 41-50 points;
- "4" 31-40 points;
- "3" 21-30 points;

Absence at module testing - 0 points.

Criteria for evaluating the final control

The final modular assessment is based on the results of module testing. Exam grade is determined depending on the rating score, or points for the exam.

The exam is a form of final control of the student's mastering of theoretical and practical material of a separate academic discipline for the semester, which is held as a control measure during the examination session.

Applicants with a semester final rating score of at least 35 points are allowed to take the exam.

The grade of the exam in the national scale (excellent, good, satisfactory, unsatisfactory) and the grade in the ECTS scale is marked on the basis of the semester rating score of the applicant for the discipline as follows:

Applicants who have not fulfilled the terms of the educational agreement and all types of compulsory work (practical tasks, individual, presentations, synopses, etc) provided according to educational programme, are not allowed to the final (semester) control, as well as the final module assessment of which is less than 35 points. The responsible employee of the dean's office in the statement next to the name of such applicant makes a mark "not allowed".

Table 1

Criteria for evaluating the final control of the discipline

- "excellent" (90-100 points, A) deserves that applicant, who showed comprehensive and indepth knowledge of the programme material, gained the ability to perform freely all the tasks provided according to the programme, mastered the basic and read additional literature, and understands the interconnection of the main concepts of the discipline and their meaning for the future profession;
- good (82-89 points, B) deserves that applicant, who showed full knowledge of the programme material, successfully performs the tasks provided according to the programme, mastered the basic literature recommended by the programme, gained systematic knowledge of the discipline and has strong judgment, but during the answer admitted some inaccuracies;
- "good" (74-81 points, C) deserves that applicant, who showed not full knowledge of the programme material, not always performs successfully the tasks provided according to the programme and is only partially familiar with the basic recommended literature, not gained systematic knowledge of the discipline, hasn't got strong judgment and during the answer admitted some inaccuracies:
- "satisfactory" (64-73 points, D) deserves that applicant applicant who showed partial knowledge of the main programme material, in the amount necessary for further study and future work in the profession, who is able to perform the tasks provided by the programme, but only partially familiar with the basic recommended literature. As a rule, this assessment is given to applicants who have made significant errors in the test, but who partially have the necessary knowledge to eliminate those mistakes with the help of the teacher.
- "satisfactory" (60-63 points, E) deserves that applicant who showed partial knowledge of the main programme material in the amount necessary for further study and future work in the profession, who is, not always able to perform the tasks provided by the programme, only partially familiar with the basic recommended literature. As a rule, this assessment is given to applicants who have made gross errors in response to the test, but who partially have the necessary knowledge to eliminate them with the help of the teacher.
- "unsatisfactory" (35-59 points, FX) is given to the applicant who has identified significant gaps in knowledge of the main programme material, made fundamental errors in the implementation of the tasks provided by the programme.
- "unsatisfactory" (0-34 points, F) is given to the applicant who during the semester made gross mistakes in performing the tasks provided by the programme.

6.4. Individual work
