Political and economic aspects of current Ukrainian – Bulgarian collaboration are analyzed in the article. Treaty lawful base of adjusting effective bilateral relations between our states is analyzed in detail. It is stressed on the importance of Bulgaria for Ukraine as one of the key states on the Balkan Peninsula.
